






















Year 7 Unit 3: Sacred in Christianity

			15.	Resurrection – rising from the dead or returning to life. Jesus rose on the third day after the crucifixion. 
1.	Sacred – something considered to be holy and deserving respect because of a connection to God. Jesus is sacred.		16.	Ascension – being taken up into heaven. Jesus ascended to heaven on the 40th day after his Resurrection. 
2.	Christian – from a Greek word meaning ‘followers of Christ’. Someone who follows Jesus.		17.	Rebel - a person who rises in opposition or armed resistance against an established government or leader. 
3.	The Cross – The symbol of Christianity. The cross symbolises the crucifixion and suffering of Jesus on a large wooden cross.			Key parables
4.	Monotheism - belief in one God. Christianity is a monotheistic religion.		18.	The Prodigal Son - A farmer who has two sons divides his wealth. One son stays to work on the family farm and saves his money, the other leaves the family home and returns years later starving and poor. When he returns his father welcomes him back and throws a party. <i>The moral is that God (Father) is always happy when his people (children) turn back to Him.</i> 
5.	Trinity - there is One God, but three distinct (separate) personas; God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.	$1 \times 1 \times 1 = 1$		
6.	Incarnation - <i>embodied in flesh</i> . Jesus, "became flesh" when he was miraculously conceived in the womb of the Virgin Mary.		19.	The Good Samaritan – a Jewish man is robbed and beaten and ignored by a Priest and a Levi (Jewish leader) who pass by. A Samaritan (an enemy of the Jews) sees him and stops to help. He takes him to an inn and pays for lodgings. <i>The moral is that you should put aside your differences and help those in need.</i> 
7.	Bethlehem – the city where Jesus was born.		20.	The Unforgiving Servant - A King is owed money by his servant. The King lets him off with the debt as he feels sorry that he can't pay. The servant is owed money by a man who can't pay him, but the servant punishes him. The King finds out, and punishes the servant. <i>The moral is to treat others the way you want to be treated.</i> 
8.	Baptism – pouring water over someone's head, or immersing them in water to show that the person is going to follow Jesus.			
9.	Disciples – someone who follows the teachings of others. Jesus had disciples who followed His teachings.			
10.	Parables – stories that teach a religious or moral lesson.			
11.	Sermons – a talk about something this is religious or moral. Someone giving a sermon may include a parable as part of their sermon.			
12.	Commandment – a rule given by God e.g. ‘love thy neighbour’.			
13.	Sacrifice - to give something up for the greater good. Jesus sacrificed His life to save mankind.			Christian celebrations about Jesus
			21.	Christmas – celebrates the birth of Jesus Christ, who Christians believe is the Son of God. 
14.	Crucifixion – a method of execution in which a person was nailed or bound to a cross and left to die.		21.	Easter - a festival remembering the resurrection of Jesus. 
			22.	Lent - the 6 weeks leading up to Easter, to remember Jesus' life.
